Over the next three years, we've lined up a full slate of projects that will expand access, improve sustainability, and create new adventures for hikers, mountain bikers, runners, and equestrians. Annual Member Dinner (early November, celebrating 1,000+ members)

Pay the Piper Trail Project - Moore Creek Park, Napa

(signature 2.2-mile loop creating year-round access)

Redwood Trails Alliance (RTA) seeks sponsors to support the construction of *Pay the Piper Trail*, a 2.5-mile, multi-use trail at Moore Creek Park in Napa County. This trail will complete a key loop in the park's "Canyon" trail network by connecting Dan's Wild Ride and Valentine Vista Trail—two of the most popular trails in the park. Designed in collaboration with local land managers and informed by community use patterns, *Pay the Piper* will also provide a year-round recreation route by avoiding multiple high-flow creek crossings that currently limit access during the rainy season.

This grassroots effort will enhance sustainable recreation opportunities, reduce user conflicts, and deepen community engagement through volunteer participation in trail construction and stewardship.
